Second Sunday of Lent

In March of 1953, Sir Edmund Hillary and others set up a base camp to attempt to reach the summit of Mount Everest in Nepal. For two months, they battled the conditions as they slowly made their way up the mountain. Finally, in May, Hillary and his Sherpa companion Tenzing Norgay became the first to reach the top of the world's tallest mountain. Sir Edmund left only one object on top of Mount Everest that day - a small crucifix.

Our quest to find the loving light of Jesus in our lives can be likened to a climb up the highest mountain. It isn't easy and it may take much longer than any of us could ever imagine. Still, to reach the top we continue looking toward the summit, never looking back from where we came. And as we come closer and closer to him, we become more and more like him, changing bit by bit until that light shines in us as well.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that Christ's transfiguration serves as strengthening the apostles' (and our) faith in anticipation of his passion. By climbing that high mountain, he has prepared for his most difficult climb up Calvary (CCC 568). Peter, James and John are privileged to make that first climb, rewarded with witnessing the Transfiguration. Consider today your climb of faith, and consider your reward. You will not look back!

Fr. Pat, a friend from Mundelein Seminary, also writes a weekly reflection. He is now 75 as he boasted this week. He still hikes and skis in Colorado.

When he was in his sixties, he climbed up Mt. Tabor, the setting for this Sunday's Gospel. It is very steep and straight up. "Tabor rises up to Heaven like an altar that the Creator built to Himself". Jesus took Peter, James and John up to the pinnacle of Mt. Tabor and transfigured himself before them. I can imagine part of their vision was that they were flush from the climb, Peter is never portrayed as very athletic. From the top you look over

the Jezreel Valley and in the far distance you can also see Nazareth and Cana.

In 1924 the Franciscans built the present Basilica. Previous churches were destroyed and had fallen to ruin by the conflicts man



had with their fellow man. The current church captures the majesty of the place where Moses and Eliah conversed with Jesus. Peter, James and John saw Jesus' face shine like the sun

and His clothes becoming as white as light.

A Voice spoke to them and said: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; LISTEN TO HIM". This is a call to us today. The Father calls us today to listen to Jesus. Just like two thousand years ago. We are called. We may not have the mountain top experience as Moses, Eliah, Peter, James and John but the Father does speak to us through the words of Jesus in the Scriptures.



Just as Moses, Eliah, Peter, James and John are different. We are too. We hear those words differently. We fit them to our lives differently. We are called differently. We are unique creations of God, beautiful and loving in our own way. God calls us to be His children. We are called to love as the Father loves.

It is the second week of Lent. This week reflect on how you are listening to the Call. How good is your hearing? How are you answering the Call? Are you a child out playing and vaguely hear the call to come home for dinner? Or are you a young lover anxiously waiting for the call from your lover? Or are you aware of the call but can't quite figure out what you are called to? Open your heart and

2008-2009 Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program Now Underway

Tuition assistance application forms for the 2008-2009 school year are now available in the parish office. Catholic families who belong to a Diocese of Gary parish and have their children enrolled in any diocesan school, grades 1-12 may apply. Kindergarten and pre-school students are not eligible. A \$20 nonrefundable processing fee must accompany the application. Approximately \$500,000 is distributed on the basis of need to assist Catholic parents in providing Catholic faith formation, strong academic programs and safety for their children in our Catholic schools.

The filing deadline is March 7, 2008. This is the date that completed applications must be returned to Fr. Mike. This deadline will be strictly enforced. Parents will be notified by the Diocese of the result in writing by May 31, 2008.
