



Beginning with a couple of unusually hot days and combining a rainy Saturday evening, it looked like we were going to do worse than last year which was, by the way, a record year. However, because our expenses were not as great this year, we did better than last year!

2009 CSA REPORT

We know that we cannot always have years as good as the year before. Last year's CSA was one of our best. However, this year, the bleak economy seems to be a factor in giving. Additionally, many people were extremely generous with our disaster relief contributions last fall and this spring, which may have brought contributions down a bit. (Our pledges are about \$30,000 less than last year.)

2009 Parish Goal:	\$ 111,437
2009 Pledges:	\$ 191,042

If all the pledges end up being paid, the parish will realize almost \$80,000 in a rebate - money that was budgeted toward our new parking lots. To date, \$32,202 is still owed on pledges made in this year's CSA.

Thank you for giving what you could. I hope you like our new parking lots! Next project is finishing our church floor.

SOME THOUGHTS

In these trying economic times, I am happy and proud to state that the financial situation at St. Thomas More Church is still very sound, due, in no small measure, to the generosity of so many parishioners.

Speaking with many pastors around the diocese, there are some parishes that have experienced drops in income up to 12%. Our collections have dropped about 3%.

However, while our collections have dropped, our general revenue has remained about the same. That was because we collected a lot of money for our disaster relief fund.

We spent \$135,466.51 in aiding those who were seriously affected by last fall's flood. Thank you for your generosity in helping the people of our community parishioner and non-parishioner alike.

I continue to be very hopeful that the people of our parish will respond by lovingly giving of their time, talent, and treasure. I truly am very proud of you for the manner in which you give of yourselves to help brothers and sisters in need.

May God continue to be with us, leading us and guiding us into the future known only to Him. May we continue to be a source of hope to those in need. And may we, one day, hear God's words, "Well done, good and faithful servant!"

In the second quarter 2009, SVDP helped 428 people with food-vs. 346 in 2008--and 632 people with utilities/rents--vs. 449 in 2008. We are getting new clients every week.

If every parishioner would bring "one" item, we would have 3,000 products to distribute to the needy. God bless you for your support and generosity.
