

Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

We need to get our bearings straight and properly lay life's cornerstone. Otherwise, the rest of our journey will be skewed, and our judgment clouded. We can recall Jesus' famous rebuke of Peter, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Even he, as one of Jesus' closest friends struggles

with understanding things and grasping the big picture. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) a renowned and learned

French Jesuit priest often has these words attributed to him: "We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience." Whether they were actually from his lips, they certainly mimic his thought. These wise words orient us and capture the essence of who we really are.

Many people consider spirituality an option. It is no wonder that they come to this conclusion when they predominantly define themselves using human terms and concepts. Immersed in this world view, they struggle finding any semblance of God because God does not work according to human expectations!

This is especially true when suffering and death enter life's picture. If we are only human beings having a spiritual experience, then we wrongly expect our spirituality to serve us as we desire. The human expectation is that my spiritual life is something that is useful in avoiding pain, hardship, and death,

not something that gives the courage to live through it! So, when we protest and get upset with God because our

journey is becoming difficult, painful, treacherous, disappointing, and even pointing us toward death, Jesus rebukes us as he did Peter and gently reminds us how to see. It is God who inspires and opens hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, the true meaning of things is understood, and we receive a depth of insight and understanding that is not found following

purely human paths. It is not our task to understand God, as God is beyond human understanding. Ours is the joyful privilege of simply resting in God's presence simply because God is God and we are who we are. As spiritual beings having an exciting and adventurous human experience, it is in our DNA to do so. Through prayer we can let go and let be. This is how we lose our lives but then save them. ©LPi

"We must never allow September 11th to become a time for protest and division. Instead, this day must remain a time for promoting peace and mutual respect." ~ Timothy Cardinal Dolan

I still remember the heated words of one of my Michigan City parishioners all those years ago shortly after the terrible tragedy on September 11, 2001. The person was speaking about the Muslims. He made a very blanket statement: "It would be better if they were all dead."

I could not believe what I was hearing. This, from a believer. From someone who called himself a Christian. From someone who claimed to believe in God, as well as God's love and mercy. Yet, at that moment in time, there was no place in his heart for mercy or forgiveness or love. There was only hatred. Raw, cold, dead hatred.

It is that hatred that is a very real part of this sinful world in which we live. It is that hatred that Jesus faced, dying a horrible death on the cross. It is that hatred that Jesus asks us to reject.

There are "bad" people in every ethnicity, in every religion, in every culture. Would it be better if the entire world were dead? Brothers and sisters, we are called to live lives of love. We are called to be witnesses to the Lord. We are called to show that this world can, indeed, be a better place if we so desire and to work toward the positive change that is so desperately needed.

There will be many programs on television and the radio this weekend commemorating the twentieth anniversary of the tragedy of September 11, 2001. Our screens will be filled with images of buildings collapsing and burning and of the names of those who perished.

That was a terrible tragedy in our nation's history. I do not claim otherwise. However, in the midst of all the programming that will take place this weekend, let not hatred claim a stake in your heart. To allow ourselves to turn from love to hatred would be an even worse tragedy.

I daresay that events of our recent past and of today will be put into the same mix as well in order to stir the pot of hatred and bigotry. Don't let people who hate steer you down a path contrary to our faith. Love will always win.

Let freedom, peace, justice, and love ring out in our land.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION The last two Tuesdays of September (21st and 28th) are inquiry days for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, also known as RCIA. RCIA is a process for those who are not Roman Catholic to enter the Church.



Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

On September 21st or September 28th (you only need to come to one of the two evenings), you are invited to come to the Parish Conference Room (enter at the Parish Office) to sign up and receive your study materials. Classes will begin in earnest on Tuesday, October 5th.

If you have been baptized in another faith, it would be helpful for you to bring a copy of your baptismal certificate with you to the September inquiry meeting.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults consists of weekly sessions with others who are interested in the faith. The sessions are every Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. and generally last a little over an hour.

The RCIA is also appropriate for those who may have been baptized as Catholic but who were never catechized or finished their sacraments. If you have been baptized but never received your First Communion or Confirmation, you are welcome to the RCIA as well. Those who come to the weekly sessions are received into the Church at the 8:00 p.m. Vigil Mass of Easter on April 16, 2022.
