

## **Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Patience is rooted in Hope( imagine a bush filled with birds). Life, like the church, is often burdened with evil, smallness, and impurities.

The Lord's parables give us a hope-filled perspective on all three.

Evil: in Jesus' parable about the good farmer whose enemy plants weeds at night, Jesus tells us that God is not the cause of evil but permits

evil to exist with good out of his patient love. He will finally deal with it, but his love lets things stay messy for a time.

Smallness: It's funny that Jesus says his kingdom looks like ... wait for it ... a bush.

What a letdown!

Yet this little shrub still somehow has room for all the birds of the sky.

The smallness of the Church, and even our own little lives, still provides plenty of room for all whom God sends. Impurities: divisions and hypocrisies in the Church

and our own hearts exasperate us.

Recall that Jesus compares his kingdom to a lump of dough with impure leaven eating away at it and therefore

making it expand. It's the secret of the Cross. Not how we'd prefer it.

But finally, great news.

The field, the bush, the loaf: all three parables invite us to embrace a patience rooted in hope:

one day the field will be weeded, the bush filled with birds, and the risen loaf leaven-free.

### **DEEP MYSTERIES, SPECIAL STORIES**

As a little boy opened the big family Bible, something fell out of it: an old leaf that had been pressed in between the pages.

"Mamma, look what I found," he shouted excitedly.

"What have you got there?" his mother asked.

With astonishment in his voice, the little boy answered: "I'm not for sure; but, I think it's Adam's underwear." ~ Unknown

In October, I will be sixty-seven years old. There are some days that I feel every minute of those sixty-seven years. There are other days that I feel it should be seventy-seven or eighty-seven. Yet, there are still other days that it feels more like seventeen. Why? Children.

Children can really keep you on your toes. Children can keep you wondering. Children can keep you young. They have such an open, innocent way of looking at their world that amazes me. Even in the joke above, we can well imagine a child thinking that he had found Adam's underwear. The reason would be quite simple. For years he would have heard about Adam and Eve. He would have heard the story about them eating the fruit of the tree and realizing that they were naked, clothing themselves with the leaves of the trees. Hence, underwear.

In the same manner of seeing things through the eyes of a child, I have often been called God. Little children, when seeing me around the church, will often say, "Hi, God", to me. If you think about it, it makes sense. Their parents tell them they are going to God's house and I am the person that they see. Therefore, it is natural to call me God.

The minds of children are keen and open and impressionable. The eyes of children see all. The ears of children hear all. They may get things wrong or confused and it becomes our responsibility to inform them of the truth of things. We just need to make sure that we do so in a loving manner. It is never easy to be told that we are wrong, even at a very young age.

Do not laugh at innocent observations. Do not ridicule innocent questions. They are ways in which people can learn the truths of life, the truths of the faith, the truths of the love and goodness of God.

When children ask me questions about the faith, it gives me the opportunity to think about new ways to explain the mystery of God. I hope it helps them to come to know God better. I know that it helps me.

FAITH ACTION: Think about the deep mysteries of the faith that have always had special meaning to you. Share them with family or friends today.




