

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

With little more than a year until the United States' national elections, I find myself feeling, like many Catholics, both dread and energized. Dread, because our democratic republic can be a messy endeavor and campaigns a long, nasty, and unedifying slog; energized, because hope for positive societal change can be enticing and engaging. As a pastor, I see similar conflicting attitudes in those whom I serve. How can Catholics best engage our political arena in a way which is truly helpful and worthwhile?

This weeks' gospel reading offers wisdom in this regard. Jesus says, "Render therefore to Caesar the things are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." This riddle forces us to answer for ourselves a hidden question: what is the relationship between political and divine authority? Two common but false

between political and divine authority? Two common but false answers lead to mischief. If we answer that the two are equivalent, politics becomes our absolute authority. This happens whenever religion is slave to the state, as in the travesty of the pro-Nazi German Christian movement in the 1930s and 40s. It also usually occurs when there is an official state religion. If we answer that the two are totally unrelated, we end up with an unchecked aggressive secularist

state as we often experience now.

Thus, religion becomes a weak and private pastime.

What's a better alternative? At our best, Christians hold that political authority does indeed have its own legitimate autonomy but is nested within God's all-encompassing authority. Think, for example, of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s respect for politics while also being able to criticize unjust human laws because he recognized a higher heavenly law. In other words, Caesar owns politics — and God owns Caesar. So, we should allow Jesus' words to lead us to have a deep

So, we should allow Jesus' words to lead us to have a deep respect and willingness to peacefully engage in politics without making that engagement our religion.

We bring our faith to bear on our politics knowing confidently that Caesar isn't God — but he is indeed God's.

I know that I can sound like a broken record at times. I have said this before: too many people wait for the perfect opportunity because they think that they need to do something big in order to make a difference. While they wait for that big opportunity, many smaller opportunities are left by the wayside, opportunities that could have positively affected other people.

Do not wait. Seize the moment. If an opportunity to do good comes our way, we should do the good. The chance may not come our way again. If we do the good, we might change a person's life for the better. Is that not what God wants us to do? Did Jesus not commission us to proclaim the Good News? Should we not reach out to others and give them what God has entrusted to us? Of course we should.

Some might say that our world is too fragile a place, too risky a place, too dangerous a place to do good for others. What we do might be misinterpreted. What we do might open us up to being used by others. What we do might get us in trouble. Yes. It might. We might be talked about. We might be misunderstood. We might be used. But if we can make a positive difference, let it be.

The world was a fragile and dangerous place for Jesus. He came to proclaim the Good News. He healed the sick and raised the dead and they crucified Him for it. He knew it would happen but He loved us too much to deny us the help we needed. Let us love others in the same manner.

FAITH ACTION: If you see an opportunity to do good for someone today, take the opportunity and make a positive impact in their life.

Prioritize emergency, corrective and preventive maintenance. Perform daily, weekly, monthly & yearly building inspections with attention to detail to identify necessary repairs. Develop routine systems to ensure constant monitoring of problem areas & develop long/short range maintenance plans.

Be responsible for budgeting and purchasing for maintenance department. Assist with planning and implementation of capital projects. Oversee vendor activities, including scheduling of repair & maintenance needs as required; closely monitor progress to ensure quality of work. Manage life/fire safety systems and emergency protocols, maintain functionality of all fire safety equipment. Oversee building security. Work as a team with the custodial






