

Third Sunday of Advent

Why do we believe in Jesus and the Catholic Church? Why should we continue to do so?

We've never seen him face-to-face (at least not most of us, I assume).

Most of us have never had mystical visions of angels or saints. We live in the same world as our atheist and secularists friends.

Why do we believe in Christ if we've never seen him? The simple, symbolic answer the Gospel presents to us this week might surprise us: we believe because of John the Baptist.

Early in John's Gospel we hear:

"There was a man sent from God, his name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him."

The Baptist powerfully announces Jesus.

This is a historical fact, and it is also now a pattern at work in our lives.

John the Baptist stands for the entirety of the old covenant, everything entrusted to the Jewish people.

And yet he prophetically opens the door to something entirely new in Jesus, to the revival and fulfillment of God's promises. In every generation, and in every human life, God continues to do this.

He has done it through people named Augustine, Francis, Catherine, Theresa, and countless others.

In my life, the Baptist's spirit has come through persons named Eric, Paul, Mary, and Ron. I challenge you to name at least three people through whom God has announced the coming of Jesus in your life.

Consciously thank God for their testimony.

And let's commit ourselves to listening to the spirit of John the Baptist testify again this week so that we might more strongly believe in the light.

LONGING FOR OUR HOME

"Christmas is built upon a beautiful and intentional paradox; that the birth of the homeless should be celebrated in every home." ~ G.K. Chesterton

Christ is drawing closer. Today, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, Rejoice Sunday: the midpoint of the Advent season. The ministers dress in rose vestments and stoles today and we breathe in the joy that awaits us in the Kingdom.

One of the reminders of the Kingdom, and one of the symbols on Jesse Trees, is Bethlehem. Bethlehem is "the place". It is where Jesus was born to us as a tiny, helpless, fragile infant. It has always blown my mind to think about that paradox.

How could the Almighty stoop, if you will, so low? What would possess the All-Powerful to become helpless? There is only one word, I believe, that would sum up the answer to that question: love. Yes. Because God loved us and loves us so much, God would do and continues to do anything and everything to help us, to guide us, and to bring us home.

Chesterton points out a great paradox. Jesus was homeless. He was powerless. He was poor. Yet Magi sought Him out and, ultimately, His birth would be celebrated throughout the ages by the homeless as well as those who have homes, by the powerless as well as those who have power, quite frankly, by the entire world.

We begin our third week of Advent by pondering so great a paradox and mystery. Open our eyes and hearts, Lord, to the wonders and reality of your great love for us!

FAITH ACTION: If you know someone in need, reach out to that person so that this season may be a blessing for him or her as well. If you know no such person, perhaps contribute to a homeless shelter or soup kitchen.



Director of Maintenance

St. Thomas More Parish

The Director of Maintenance will provide maintenance leadership to our parish facilities and grounds through organizing, planning and implementing programs to support preventative & corrective maintenance improvements.

The successful candidate must be able to:

Work to prioritize, delegate, supervise, and instruct as needed the maintenance staff in areas such as plumbing, electrical, carpentry and HVAC. Prioritize emergency, corrective and preventive maintenance. Perform daily, weekly, monthly & yearly building inspections with attention to detail to identify necessary repairs. Develop routine systems to ensure constant monitoring of problem areas & develop long/short range maintenance plans.

Be responsible for budgeting and purchasing for maintenance department. Assist with planning and implementation of capital projects. Oversee vendor activities, including scheduling of repair & maintenance needs as required; closely monitor progress to ensure quality of work. Manage life/fire safety systems and emergency protocols, maintain functionality of all fire safety equipment. Oversee building security.

Work as a team with the custodial department/supervisor. Communicate well & provide clear, concise details. Perform tasks safely with tools/ladders/lifts.

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, such as our parish. As long as certain requirements are met, QCDs can fulfill your required minimum distribution (RMD), avoid paying income tax on the distribution, and provide a significant gift to support the work and mission of our parish.

A few points when considering an IRA QCD:

- The donor must be 70½ years old or older.
- The distribution must transfer directly from your IRA to St. Thomas More Church
- Each individual can donate up to \$100,000 from an individual IRA
- The donor can designate where the funds are to go Sunday Collections, CSA, St. Vincent De Paul, etc.
- The gift would not be eligible for a charitable income tax deduction

Please consult your tax adviser to determine if this charitable giving strategy is an option for you.




