

## **Fourth Sunday of Advent**

Life is troubling. Who among us has not struggled with anxiety and difficulties, sometimes massive ones? I certainly have, as have many of my loved ones. If we do, does this mean that we don't trust the Lord or just need to toughen up?

I don't think so. How encouraging for us anxious and troubled souls to hear Luke describe the Blessed Mother Mary in these words, "But she was greatly troubled at what was said." An archangel has visited her. An inconceivable promise has been made to her. Her life has become wildly unpredictable, perhaps more so than any person before or since.

The first point for us: the Lord is with her precisely when she is troubled.

Her anxiousness and God's presence are not mutually exclusive. Christianity is not about a trance-like robotic indifference. It's about the presence of divine love. Even in — especially in — troubled circumstances.

Our troubled soul can become our greatest treasure. What seems so troubling at first to Mary becomes the best possible thing, Jesus, the Savior and Lord, is now her son. All the difficulties and troubles remain, and yet her movement into the fullness of God is accelerated. What is troubling you right now? This

scripture invites us now, this week, to hear the Lord's messenger say to us what he said to Mary, "Do not be afraid! You have found favor with God."

Like no other, and yet no different. That is the great paradox of the birth of Jesus on Christmas. He was an infant like no other since He was the Son of God. Yet, by all appearances, He was like any other baby: tiny, fragile, and totally helpless. It was to you and me that Jesus came as an infant. He came to save us from our sins. And coming as a tiny infant, He came with an invitation.

What would that invitation be, you might ask? What do you think? Have you ever been around an infant? What is the very first thing that goes through your mind? For most people, the invitation of an infant is to pick the infant up, to cuddle the infant, to let the infant know that he or she is loved, cherished, and protected.

The touch of others is often enough to make an infant stop crying. Picking up and carrying an infant is enough to make the infant fall asleep. God came to us as an infant. He wants us to pick Him up, to hold Him, to cradle Him, and to love Him just as much as He loves us.

The "magical moment" is about to happen once again as the clock strikes midnight and Christmas comes about. We will celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ and remind ourselves that He will come again. Thus our Advent preparation will need to continue throughout the Advent of our lives.

Prepare to greet Christ, the Lord.

I just want to caution you about one thing: many people, when Christmas arrives, make the mistake of saying, "It's finally here. Now it's over." Uh, uh. No, no. Absolutely not. Christmas is here and will remain here for a while. Liturgically, Christmas is celebrated for an entire Octave. And when the eight days of Christmas are complete, we enter into the Christmas season which doesn't end until after the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord.

Christmas, therefore, is more than a day. It is more than an Octave. It is more than a season. It is a way of life. We should live the joy and peace of Christmas each day, letting people know of our great love for God and of God's great love for us.

Sadly, Christmas is often tainted by the world around us. We have been inundated by Christmas carols on the radio since Halloween. 

## IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

Donors age 70½ or older may qualify to make a charitable gift directly from an IRA to St. Thomas More Church.

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, such as our parish. As long as certain requirements are met, QCDs can fulfill your required minimum distribution (RMD), avoid paying income tax on the distribution, and provide a significant gift to support the work and mission of our parish.

#### A few points when considering an IRA QCD:

- The donor must be  $70\frac{1}{2}$  years old or older.
- The distribution must transfer directly from your IRA to St. Thomas More Church
- Each individual can donate up to \$100,000 from an individual IRA
- The donor can designate where the funds are to go Sunday Collections, CSA, St. Vincent De Paul, etc.
- The gift would not be eligible for a charitable income tax deduction






